 Play with objects that are from the past and talk about what they would have been used for. Re-tell information about their own life story as told to them by their parents. Re-tell information about their family history as told to them by their parents. Show an interest in different occupations for example vet, fire fighter, scientist, nurse. 	 Begin to ask questions about various sources that are set in or about the past and comment how things were different or the same to the present. Begin to show understanding of why the past was different. Talk about events/artefacts using everyday words such as 'before I was born' and 'now'. Talk about how the lives of families were similar and different in the past. Begin to understand that the past is made up of events that have already happened. Begin to sequence pictures to show time order. Talk about how toys were different in the past. Talk about how the local area was different in the past.
