This half term we will be learning the following things. Here are also some useful hints and tips for helping at home.

	At School	At Home
English	 This half term in English children will be learning: To write a setting description To write a new ending to a story To write a recount about our school trip 	 Listen to and support your child to read their school reading practise book. Encourage and support your child to enjoy their reading for pleasure book which they are able to borrow weekly from the school library. Ensure you child reads at least four times a week, even better if reading is done daily!
Maths	 In maths children will be learning to: Solve and write multiplication and division number sentences Show that multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative) and division of one number by another cannot Solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods, and multiplication and division facts, in- cluding problems in contexts. 	 Encourage and support your child to use the Numbots and White Rose 1 Minute Maths apps Practise fact fluency with your child. Our weekly focus will be posted on Dojo
Music	 Our topic this half term is 'Friendship Song'. During this topic children will learn: To listen to and appraise several pop songs with the theme of friendship How songs can tell a story or describe an idea. To compose a simple melody using simple rhythms, choosing from the notes C + D or C, D or E. 	 Can your child sing the song to you? Listen to pop music together and practise finding the pulse When listening to music, discuss what you like or dislike about it and why
History	 Our investigation question for this term is: What impact did the Great Fire of London have on Britain? . During this we will learn: To place the Great Fire of London on a timeline of things we have learnt in history so far in KS1 What happened during the Great Fire and how we know so much about it What the impact of the Great Fire was 	 Read books together about the Great Fire of London.
Art	 This half term we will be studying sculpture with the theme of 'The Natural World'. During this topic we will learn: About the artist Peter Randall-Page To make a clay tile which captures a range of textures from the natural world To make a pinch pot inspired by nature 	 Visit MIMA or look at examples of famous artwork online.

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	At School	At Home
P.S.H.E.	 Our PSHE topic this half term is 'Relationships', during which we will learn: To understand that there are lots of forms of physical contact within a family and that some of this is acceptable and some is not To identify some of the things that cause conflict with my friends To understand that sometimes it is good to keep a secret and sometimes it is not good to keep a secret To express my appreciation for the people in my special relationships 	 Discuss who can help us if we feel upset both at home and at school. If you would like access to the PSHE lessons for this half term in more detail, please contact us and we can provide you with an access code.
P.E.	 In P.E., pupils will be focusing on striking and fielding and athletics. Children will learn: How to throw and strike a ball Jump in a variety of ways 	 Encourage your child to take part in daily physical exercise.
R.E.	 This half term we will begin to explore the question 'How should we care for others?'. Children will learn about: Creative ways to express their own ideas about the creation story and what it says about what God is like Some texts from different religions that promote the 'Golden Rule', and think about what would happen if people followed this idea more 	 Discuss how different people believe different things and that all beliefs should be respected. Discuss how you care for each other at home
Science	 Our topic this half term is 'Living things and their habitats'. During this children will learn: What all living things have in common (the seven life processes) What a habitat is and where different plants and animals live Why different plants and animals are suited to different environments About food chains and why plants and animals need each other 	 Look at what plants and animals live in your garden. How are they suited for that environment?
